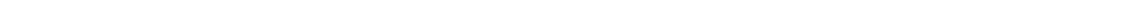

BIRIYANI CHALLENGE IN ASSOCIATION WITH SHADE DIALYSIS CENTRE VENGARA

On August 15, 2025, NSS Unit 213 of Kottakkal Farook Arts and Science College, in collaboration with SHADE Dialysis Center, Vengara, successfully conducted a "Biryani Challenge." The primary objective of this fundraising initiative was to provide financial assistance for the medical treatment of patients undergoing dialysis at the center.

Preparations for the challenge commenced three days prior to the event. NSS volunteers were divided into five groups, which visited households and shops across various localities near the college to collect orders. This dedicated outreach effort resulted in 433 biriyani orders, reflecting the strong support and generosity of the local community.

On the day of the event, the SHADE Dialysis Center team prepared the biriyani and delivered it to the college premises. Upon receipt, the volunteers reorganized themselves to ensure the prompt and accurate delivery of the packets to the respective homes and shops from which orders had been collected.

The program was a resounding success, raising a total of ₹48750/-, which was formally handed over to the SHADE Dialysis Center. Beyond the financial contribution, the initiative played a crucial role in raising public awareness about the importance of community support and social responsibility. For the volunteers, it was a valuable opportunity to experience teamwork, strategic planning, and practical service to society.

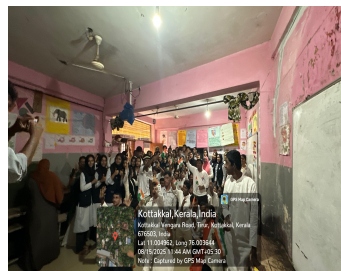

Avoid disposing sanitary napkins in bathroom areas.

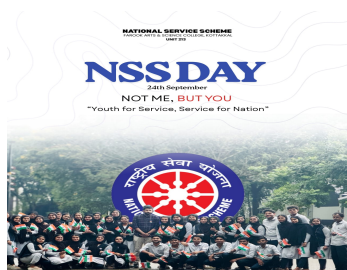
Do not throw waste anywhere inside the campus.

NSS 7 DAY SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL CAMP

The 7-day residential special camp of NSS Unit 213 of Kottakkal Farook Arts and Science College commenced on December 23, 2025, with a formal inauguration ceremony. The camp was inaugurated by Prof. Abid Hussain Thangal, MLA, who graced the occasion as the chief guest. Mr. Avaruppa Haji, Manager of BMMUP School, delivered the presidential address, setting the tone for the week-long community service initiative. Mr. Suhail K P, NSS Programme Officer, welcomed the gathering and outlined the objectives and planned activities of the special camp.

The inauguration ceremony witnessed felicitations from several distinguished personalities who emphasized the importance of community service and youth engagement. Mr. T. Following the completion of camp arrangements, an ice-breaking session titled "Who am I?" was conducted to foster bonding among the volunteers. The session was led by Mr. Mohammed Noufal, NSS Malappuram District Coordinator, who employed interactive activities to help volunteers overcome initial hesitation and build team spirit. This session played a crucial role in creating a comfortable environment for the volunteers to engage openly in the subsequent camp activities.

The camp featured three major community service projects that directly benefited local institutions and public spaces. The first project involved cleaning, maintenance, and picture drawing on the walls of an Anganwadi, enhancing its aesthetic appeal and creating a child-friendly environment. The second initiative focused on a cleaning drive at the Public Health Centre (PHC) and its premises, contributing to improved hygiene standards at the healthcare facility. The third project centered on the beautification of BMMUP School through the creation of a butterfly garden, Painting, drawing pictures against drug abuse, and writing motivational slogans by eminent personalities on the school walls.

The camp organized six major interactive and educational sessions designed to enhance the personal development and practical skills of the volunteers. Mr. Sharafudheen, Psychological Architect, conducted "MENTIS MAGNA," a psychological first aid session that equipped volunteers with mental health awareness and crisis intervention techniques. A thought-provoking debate titled "Do Influencers Actually Influence Us?" was moderated by Mr. Mohammed Shafeeque U, ASAP Trainer, encouraging critical thinking among participants. Mr. Yasir GKZ, a mentalist, presented "Mindcape," a fascinating mentalism session that captivated the volunteers and demonstrated the power of observation and perception.

The skill enhancement component included a Basic Life Support (BLS) training session conducted by Team Revomed Health care, providing volunteers with essential life-saving techniques. Mr. Hafsal Rahman, HR Trainer, delivered a comprehensive skill development training program that focused on employability and professional competencies. These diverse sessions ensured a holistic learning experience that combined community service with personal

and professional growth.

The camp concluded with an extensive Valedictory session on December 29, 2025, at 11:00 AM, where participants and dignitaries reflected on the week's accomplishments. Mr. V.A. Rahiman, President of Ponmala Panchayath inaugurated the session. Mr. Basheer Poolakkal, Ward Member, Prof. M. Abdul Azeez, Principal of KFASC, Dr. Mustafa K, Deputy Principal of KFASC, and Mr. Rasheed, HM In Charge of BMMUP School, participated in the session and commended the volunteers for their dedication. Mr. Salif, Club Coordinator, and Mr. Suhail K P, NSS Programme Officer, along with volunteers Aiswarya K, Afsitha M, Aswathy K, Mohammed Shafeeque U, and Fasal, also shared their experiences and valuable feedback.
